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### Why Does Early Childhood Matter? THE FOUNDATION FOR LIFELONG HEALTH AND SUCCESS

 A child that has an affordable and quality early education program will be better prepared for kindergarten, read earlier, be more likely to graduate high school and attend college, earn a higher wage, live a healthier life and have better developed life skills.

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#### Childcare Access in Larimer County THE STATE OF THE SECTOR: Access and Affordability

of LARIMER COUNTY

#### \$12,000 per year

The average cost Larimer County families pay per year per child for childcare, often \$16-20k for an infant.

#### 75% shortage

in childcare access for families with infants who cannot find care. 40% with preschoolers who cannot find care.

#### 37% of income

*(based on an average median HHI of \$64,919)* Spent on childcare for a family of four with two kids under the age of 5



## How do we solve the access crisis?

<u>Up to \$10M distributed</u> <u>directly to Larimer</u> <u>County families</u> to offset the cost of child care tuition \*See Appendix A






<u>Up to \$7M invested into the early</u> <u>childhood workforce</u> through recruitment and retention strategies, and salary supplementation <u>Up to \$2M invested into capital</u> <u>projects to increase the</u> <u>number of programs</u> in Larimer County through new builds and renovation of existing spaces.



## How do we solve the access crisis?



Approx. 1000 early childhood educators will see their annual income increase



Larimer County can expect to see positive economic gains as a result of increased access to childcare

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Up to 85% of ECE programs in Larimer County will receive quality improvement and workforce support
