DID YOU KNOW?

The population of Coloradans aged 65 and older is growing at 4x the rate of those aged 64 and under.

80% of older adults say they lack the financial resources to cover the care they will likely need in the future.

More than 40% of adults over the age of 60 report frequent feelings of isolation and loneliness, impacting both mental and physical wellness.

Around 1% of all philanthropic dollars public and private are dedicated to adults over 65.





Who We Are



Formed in 2005 by a group of Washington Park neighbors, ALH helps older neighbors age well in place by connecting them to an important resource that is plentiful in every community: good neighbors.

Launched in Fort Collins in 2016 followed by Berthoud and Loveland. In 2022, ALH expanded its services into western Weld County (Windsor/Severance, Johnstown/Milliken).

We lighten the load and brighten the days of our older members so they can age well at home through services such as yardwork, transportation, snow shoveling, handy help, friendly visits and more.

How We Serve

The core of our services are provided by compassionate volunteers throughout Larimer County. More than 500 older adults throughout Larimer County receive services from A Little Help volunteers.

Impact

We believe A Little Help is the most creative and financially efficient affordable housing solution for older adults in the State.



A Little Help is a nationally awarded model in the Village-to-Village network.

92% of survey respondents had some level of difficulty accessing resources that ALH now provides them.

2024: Completed 1300 individual service requests in Larimer County (not including group volunteering)

80% of our survey

respondents report

that ALH has helped

them stay in their

homes at least three

additional years.

2024: Provided more than 3500 service hours to older adults in Larimer County We estimate that our annual economic impact is over \$30M to families and taxpayers of Colorado.



Transportation needs of our aging community and associated concerns




Projected Percent Change by Age Group Larimer County





Finding safe, affordable transportation















SAINT Ridership 1998-2023 (calendar year)

82,000 Larimer County residents are 60 years or older. The work we do directly touches the lives of thousands of people. PAFC is dedicated to helping older adults maintain independence and quality of life as they age.

Our Impact

The Age-Friendly Workplace Initiative presented to over 400 local business owners and Human Resource teams about the many benefits of hiring and retaining an age-diverse workforce including increased productivity and increased profitability. Served over 30 participants 55+ providing workforce employment.

In 2022, PAFC launched **Sound Affects** connecting professional musicians with underserved adults living in care facilities or at home. To date has provided 650 performances to 1500 residents in 35 facilities utilizing 178 musicians and 4 Artist Residencies.

Twenty **Lunch and Learns** were provided to the community to share and promote available resources for older adults.

In 2023, over **88 volunteers** donated over 2,600 hours, fostering older adults to contribute their knowledge, skills, and experiences, fostering a sense of value and fulfillment.

Tech Buddy Support Program offers tech support to older adults within Larimer County. In 2023, PAFC served over 100 individuals with one on one person-centered tech support and trained two additional tech buddies.

In partnership with CSU's Center for Public Deliberation, a

genHerous event brought seven generations of women together in conversation to talk about their lives, share advice, and build intergenerational connections with one another. genHerous fosters a compassionate perspective of ourselves and other women across generations.

The **Graceful Aging Insights Blog** is a team of local writers who contribute to monthly columns highlighting people's experiences related to aging.

PAFC produced **Larimer County Manufactured Home Resident Handbook** and distributed over 5,000 copies locally to residents

living in manufactured/mobile homes. This handbook helps residents find the right resources quickly and easily for assistance that is needed.

The **Lifelong Homes Initiative** is a collaboration with the CSU Institute for the Built Environment to stimulate more Lifelong homes in the community. PAFC is a member of the AARP Network of Age-Friendly Communities and Lifelong Colorado.
